Parish Council.

Early in March some Parish Councillors and volunteers from the village helped with a litter pick giving up a Saturday morning to collect from the verges 10 large bags of rubbish. Sadly they were unable to cover all the village in the morning and so some areas may not have been cleared. We are mainly a cul-de-sac village with no through traffic and there are a number of litter and dog waste bins in the village so there is really no excuse for this amount of litter to accumulate. Apart from having a cleaner village the other good thing that came out of this was that 5 people who saw what was being done volunteered to help with any future litter pick should it be needed.

Volunteers have worked on cutting back the hedge in the play area. A contractor has been asked to 'make up' the slide mound so this may be out of action for a few days at some time in the near future. It was noted that some work is needed on the seat and repairs to the soft surfacing are also planned. Emergency repairs to the guttering on the bus shelter have been done and more work on this has been ordered. A councillor has volunteered to give the shelter a good clean inside. A spring tidy up and trimming of the hedge in the cemetery has been completed.

A boat sunk at the moorings on the river has again been drawn to the attention of the Environment Agency.

Salt bins have been refilled and hopefully will not now be needed until next winter. It was agreed to respond to the request from Ely & District Citizens Advice Bureau for a donation to their work. Following a recent survey some trees in the Cemetery and on Oakfield are due to be cut back because they are getting near to overhead electricity cables, as are others on private property - there will be no charge to the parish for this work.

Correspondence has been received from Cambridgeshire ACRE regarding a heating oil bulk buying scheme for parishes – more information can be obtained from their website -cambsacre.org.uk Each parish would need a local co-ordinator and members of the scheme are asked to pay a small membership fee – this would be recouped easily by the lower price paid for the oil. The Parish Council would like to hear from anyone willing to act as a local co-ordinator – full details of what would be involved are on the Website. Enquiries about the scheme can be also be obtained by speaking to Julie Weeks on 01353 860850. This would seem an ideal opportunity to pick up one of the aims of the Parish Plan so do please give this some thought.

Finally a reminder that the Parish Council is still short of two councillors – if you think this is something you could do for our village please speak with the Parish Clerk, Mrs Sandra Thompson about the possibility of co-option onto the Parish Council. The next Parish Council Meeting is to be held on Wednesday April 11th 7:30pm in the Village Hall and on April 25th The Annual Parish Meeting will be held – this is an opportunity for all the local organisations to report to the residents their work in the parish over the past 12 months – usually an interesting and informative meeting.

BUS SUBSIDIES - WHAT YOU MAY LIKE TO KNOW

Around 80 per cent of public transport in Cambridgeshire is run commercially with the remaining 20 per cent being subsidised by the County Council, at a cost of around £2.7 million per year. Work is already underway with operators to see if changes to routes and timetables could make some marginal subsidised journeys commercially viable and therefore reduce this financial commitment.

The Council has also reviewed the way subsidies are currently paid and has started a phased three year change programme. Over the next three years the Council will be transforming how these subsidised services are delivered, resulting in an annual investment of $\pounds 1.5$ million.

Before any subsidy is removed it is planned to carry out consultation to find out people's public transport needs. Everyone will be invited to contribute and work together to find the best and most cost effective way of meeting that need.

The results will vary across the County and one size will not fit all. Solutions may include local operators, smaller vehicles, links to commercial hubs, such as the Busway or Park and Ride as well as direct routes to certain destinations and flexible dial a ride type services. If there is enough demand it could lead to more travel opportunities, not less. If the best solution to deliver an essential service is to retain the current form of subsidy, then that will still be an option.

The new initiatives will be rolled out under the banner of Cambridgeshire Future Transport starting from April 2012. Subsidised services have been grouped into 13 geographical areas which have transport links within them and these areas will be reviewed in three tranches over the next three years. This is so that the services can be looked at as a whole and alternatives explored.
