<u>St George's Church.</u> There is always a warm welcome for you in the churches of Little Thetford, whether you are new to the village, or have lived here for many years.

Services at St George's are usually at 9.30am, except when we go to the Baptist Chapel, every other month - then it is 10.30am. There is crèche space in a carpeted area at the back of church if that is helpful for parents / carers with small children. LITTLE THETFORD VILLAGE HALL

The village hall remains the only place within the village for holding public meetings, parties, celebrations and other events attracting more than a few people and provides a service for other village organisations and individuals. The hall is let at very reasonable market rates and has become a popular venue for people from the wider Ely area. The hall's only income comes from lettings; nevertheless concessionary charges are granted to village organisations seeking to raise funds or which have few funds (or none at all) of their own. No charge is made for funeral receptions for village residents. The weekly post office is hosted free of charge. It is 'home' to the Ely Guild of Wood Turners and known nationally for that.

The Trustees (whose number decreases year on year, despite my annual plea for more candidates) worked throughout the year to maintain the hall's facilities to a satisfactory standard to help in attracting more event and conference business, although they are now very aware that large scale decorating and refurbishment is required fairly imminently. The current economic climate has not assisted income flow and in February the hall lost a major client when the pre-school moved to its own premises. On the plus side that has served to free-up weekday mornings so that the hall can now be utilised for whole day events. Despite that loss income has remained fairly level although there is no cause for complacency. In order to maintain a satisfactory balance of reserve funds the Trustees have not felt able to put into train any of the possible building improvements for which planning permission has been granted with the exception of the refurbishment of the lounge which was carried out in association with our partners the Sports and Social Club. As with the internal decoration Trustees are still all too aware that the external appearance (especially the front elevation) leaves much to be desired and are currently investigating how funds could

become available to allow some modernising improvements to be made in the coming year.

The village hall remains a stake-holder (together with the Parish Council and the Sports & Social Club) in the "Oakfield" recreation project.

Finally, at risk of becoming too repetitive and boring, I must say again what I say every year. Under its constitution all village organisations are entitled to have two representatives on the board of Trustees; some only have one, most have none at all. Individuals who are independent of any organisation constitute the remainder of the Board. New Trustees are urgently required and that need will become greater from next year as several active but long serving Trustees have indicated that they will not be able to continue in the role beyond the end of 2011 at latest and unless others willing to step into the role are forthcoming an alternative form of managing and maintaining the village hall will have to be considered.

(Sadly only very few people attended this years A.G.M. for the Village Hall and for the Conservation Group. As these are both great assets to our village it was agreed, as an exception, that the Chairman's reports be included in this edition so that the whole community is made aware of the current concerns.)

LITTLE THETFORD PARISH CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS

Better known to most people as the Conservation Group. It is in fact just that, a group of people who are interested in conservation in its widest sense and who join together from time to time to help to maintain the conservation area at the bottom of Oakfield playing fields and whose interests may extend to other areas of open, public land within the parish of Little Thetford. Although it has a constitution and currently a healthy balance of funds (which are held by the Parish Council) there is no formal membership and no fees to pay. A number of responders to the Parish Plan earlier this year indicated that conservation is important to them and that they would be interested in joining with others on an occasional basis to help the efforts of the group. Currently the conservation area is looked after by a very small number of volunteers who have not been able to further the constitutional aim to "conserve and manage other areas of public land within the parish of Little Thetford as opportunity may arise". The AGM held on Wednesday 14 July (for which notice was given in the last newsletter) was unfortunately so poorly attended that no quorum was obtained so a committee and officers could not be elected. Those present decided to continue on an ad hoc basis as last year – the AGM in 2009 was in-quorate also – for the time being, until such time as the Parish Council has opportunity to consider how best for conservation within the village to be managed in future. It has been decided to hold a week-end of conservation activities on the mornings of Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th September. Meeting at the village hall at 10am the Saturday session will take the form of a walk of some (presumably not all – there's about 14 of them!) of the designated footpaths in the village to familiarise ourselves with them and investigate the possibilities for volunteer preservation of and conservation within those footpaths. A light lunch of soup, rolls and tea/coffee will be served afterwards in the village hall. The Sunday session will again start at 10am. and will be a working party on the conservation area itself to trim and tidy hedges, retie trees to stakes, make good any dilapidations in the planting or fencing and to discuss what other action might be further undertaken. There won't be any heavy digging or lifting (unless anyone is particularly keen to do so.) Another light lunch will be served after a couple of hours or so when we are all fed up or all the work has been done. (Remember the social club bar opens at midday on Sundays so members could enjoy even more conservation related chat together over further refreshment if they wish.) Please come to one or both of those morning sessions in September if you possibly can. We'll look forward to seeing you. (It would help catering if you could let Christine or Robert Bullen know beforehand on 649268 or robert.bullen1@tesco.net.)

Cllr Bill Hunt was present at the July meeting and gave a report on the various expenditure cuts that the County Council are having to make. He also advised of a website 'Fix My Street' where road repairs such as pot holes can be directly reported by anyone for repair.

Councillors were pleased to hear that the lettering on the War Memorial has been repaired and Cllr .Russell has undertaken to clean the stonework of the memorial.

Cllr Mortimer will be reporting on the Parish Plan to East Cambs. District Council on October 11th. The gate to the Conservation Area has been repaired.

A submission to the Jointly Funded Minor Improvement Scheme this year is a road safety request to have some additional signing and white lining in The Wyches and Main Street. This is just a bid for funding for these items – it may not be successful!

The retrospective planning application for a builders yard on land east of Quarterway House has been refused and an application for the construction of a 3 bedroom dwelling in Holt Fen has been withdrawn. An additional seat is to be placed in the Wyches and repairs to the bench in Holt Fen are to be carried out. Councillors were saddened to hear that the new piece of equipment on the Play Area has not been installed to the standard required and are in discussion with the company to get this rectified as soon as possible.
