Conservation Area.

During the extremely bad weather before Christmas when the ground was snow-covered and puddles, ponds and ditches were frozen over, (the conservation area being no exception) some bright spark, or sparks, decided it would be great fun to throw the conservation area pond life-belts into the water. Not only did they throw the rings but the whole of the attached safety rope as well so far into the pond that they could not be reached. The pond iced over and the rings and ropes were held solidly by the ice in the middle of the pond. There was evidence of some idiots then actually playing on the ice. It wasn't for several days that the life-rings could be reached and replaced in their housings ready for use in a genuine emergency should one occur. Whilst the life-rings were held firmly in the ice they could obviously not be used should anybody who had been foolish enough to venture onto the ice got into difficulties. A second set of equipment was purchased (at a cost of £69 – money that had been raised and donated by village residents for conservation) although it did not arrive until after the originals had been retrieved. They will now be kept in store as spares. Whilst the pond was without life-ring protection, conservation volunteers and Parish Councillors assisted by other parishioners made numerous visits to the area, in extremely bitter weather, in efforts to ensure the safety of irresponsible as well as responsible users of our very popular recreational and conservation facility. It is to be hoped that we have seen the last of the very cold weather for this winter and that the pond will not freeze over again. Whereas the pond and conservation area as a whole is perfectly safe if used wisely and responsibly for the purpose for which it is intended, it really goes without saying, or should do, that ICE, is **DANGEROUS**. It should **NOT** be played on. The pond is for everybody's enjoyment but it is NOT for paddling or swimming in no matter how adventurous you might feel. Adults should be aware of this and parents really must make their children aware of the risks involved. Removing the life rings from their proper places is NOT a game; it could literally mean the difference between life and death to someone, even possibly for those irresponsible enough to play loose with other peoples' safety as well as their own.

Dog Fouling (AGAIN!)

Dog fouling remains a problem throughout the village as a whole and is the subject of regular complaints. It is increasingly prevalent on "Oakfields" sport and recreational field. The vast majority of dog owners and walkers are highly responsible and pick up their pet's residue and put it into the bins provided around the village. Unfortunately there must still be some owners around who are more anti-social than most and who create a bad image of dog owners in general. Dog fouling is unpleasant, unsocial and un-hygienic. The poor dogs can't help it, but their walkers can. Will dog walkers please be aware that children as well as youths and adults play on the games field. It's not nice, and could be potentially injurious to health, for a kiddie to step in, or worse, to fall into a pile of excrement; nor when you've completed a superb sliding tackle to get up with your kit and skin covered in . . .!! PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE, if you are not in the habit of clearing up after your dog, start now, for everybody's sake. The playing field is for every ones enjoyment not just yours. And don't you know your pet will be happier too knowing that it and its owner are being 'good'. Enjoy your walk and help everybody to enjoy theirs.
