VILLAGE HALL PUBLIC MEETING

Monday 25 April @ 8pm. in the hall

Your LAS T chance to SAVE the village hall

As has been reported repeatedly over the last year a number of the current Trustees of the village hall will be resigning from the Board of Trustees at the next AGM (date to be confirmed, but probably early September.) From that date there will be too few Trustees to continue to oversee the continued existence of the hall. Under its Trust Deed the hall should be administered by SEVEN Elected members and EIGHT Representative members appointed by the Women's Institute, The Baptist Chapel, The PCC and the Parish In practice, as organisations within the village come and go over the years, Representative members have been drawn from other organisations from within the village and other bodies that use the hall regularly although for several years now only the Parish Council has nominated any Representative members and the Charity has struggled to engage sufficient village residents and other representatives to continue to administer and operate the hall. The current Trustees have tried, and will continue so to do, to find alternative arrangements for managing the hall but to date only informal discussions with the Sports & Social Club along the lines of a form of joint administration have born any fruit. The hall charity Trustees may appoint whosoever they chose (for instance an agent or dedicated caretaker) to operate and manage the hall on a day to day basis but it must be overseen by a Board of Trustees which has the responsibility of ensuring that the hall is being run properly in accordance with its trust deed. Any alteration in status or proposal to liquidate the assets of the charity <u>must</u> be put to a public meeting. Thus a **Public Meeting** is being called as notified above. Money is not in particular the problem, but it has to be said that, unfortunately, a lack of willingness, desire and commitment from individuals, organisations and other bodies, hitherto, is. It may not be necessary – indeed it should be the desire of every village resident and user of the hall that it will not be - to liquidate the hall and its assets if, at that meeting, sufficient interest is shown in the continuation of the village hall. If there is insufficient commitment at that meeting it is very likely that the hall will have to close and its tenants and customers – Sports & Social Club, Ely Guild of

David is coming to St. Georges at 7.00 pm. on Thursday 7th April to give an illustrated talk titled 'Blick Mead, the cradle of Stonehenge?' David is a senior research fellow of Buckingham University and has spent more than a decade on the site of Vespasins Camp, an Iron Age hill fort, and one of the pivotal places in the history of Stonehenge. During this time he found evidence that Blick Mead had probably been in use for 3,000 years during the Mesothiliac period. His work was featured in a television programme last year and we are thrilled that he has agreed to come and share his experiences with us. PARISH COUNCIL & PARISH NOTICES

Planning: Councillors have raised no objections to a planning application for a roof extension at "The Acacias", Ely Road, or to a slightly revised application for a small side extension and detached garage at 19 Main Street. Cllrs. have recommended the Planning Authority refuse an application for outline consent for an entranceway and up to 8 dwellings on land south of Two Acres caravan park, Ely Road, on the grounds that the additional traffic generated will further increase the problems at the A10 corner and the inadequate drainage at the corner and overall the village infrastructure will not be able to sustain further development at that site which is outside the development envelope.

Playground: A further report on the condition of the playground received from the ECDC inspector has been noted by Cllrs. Damage to the junior swing seats has been caused by vandalism. The Clerk has been tasked to order two new seats for the junior swings as well as two replacement seats for the toddler swings and new rope for the Burma Bridge which are showing signs of wear. Neither set of swings or the bridge are in a dangerous condition. ECDC direct workforce is to be requested to effect minor repairs to the fencing, gate and the swing safety surfaces. The bearings on the carousel are thought to be worn although this is very low risk. Cllrs. have been advised that repair could cost as much as £1,800. This situation has been noted and will continue to be monitored.

<u>Highways</u>: The potholes in Holt Fen will again be reported to the Highways dept. as is the continued concern at the deterioration in the road markings at the A10 junction. The Parish Council insists that this is a matter of safety and should receive priority. Highways are to be asked to again deal with the overgrown hedging on the path from New Close Road to The Wyches.

Street Lights: It is understood that, commencing on a date tbc in April, the street lights will be switched off from 2am.

Pavements: Residents are again asked to be more considerate of pedestrians, particularly the very young, elderly and infirm, and to NOT park on or obstruct pavements.

A CLT for Little Thetford? A CLT (Community Land Trust) is a non-profit organisation set up and run for the benefit of the community. It could help to provide some 'affordable' housing for local people and a small degree of local control over future development. (The new development at Stretham, some of which is CLT led is an example.) There are varying opinions as to whether or not a CLT would be viable or even wanted in Lt. Thetford and indeed if there is any need for affordable housing within the village. There are many issues to be considered, but it is important to realise that CLTs are set up and run by volunteers (with some professional assistance where needed) not necessarily Councillors. The leaflet delivered with this newsletter gives some information and the Parish Council has arranged for a presentation to be given by the CLT East professional adviser at the Annual Parish Meeting to be held on Wednesday 18 May @ 7.30 in the village hall. Attendance at that presentation and meeting will indicate the degree of interest/commitment (or lack of it) within the village for a CLT.

A village litter pick 'spring clean' is to be held on Saturday 23 April starting from the carpark @ 10am. This is NOT just for Councillors; everybody concerned with the appearance of our village environment is urged to attend – suitable equipment is provided – the more the merrier and the less time it will take. We will be linked into the "Clean for the Queen" campaign being promoted by VCAEC and Ely City Council.

<u>Charity Run:</u> Nothing to do with the Parish but we are advised that a "Wings for Life" charity run requiring rolling road closures will be held on Sunday 8 May. Neither the A10 or Little Thetford will be directly affected but if you are travelling it might be as well to avoid the Wilburton/Haddenham area from about 1pm – 3pm that day. A map and more information will be on the noticeboard.
