LITTLE THETFORD VILLAGE HALL (registered charity 105086) Chairman's report - AGM 25 June 2015

End of year (31 December 2014) accounts show total income for the year of twelve and a half thousand pounds, one thousand two hundred pounds up on the previous year, against expenditure of nearly eleven thousand eight hundred. Maintenance and improvement costs were half of the previous year's total however, whereas income from staged events was the same. During the year Trustees agreed to the necessity of reducing the deposits by a further £1,000. I make no further comment on the year's accounts or on the current financial situation and leave that to our new Treasurer, Peter Frew, who I now formally welcome onto the Board of Trustees with the grateful thanks of us all for taking on the role following the sudden resignation of the previous Treasurer. Fund raising events sponsored by the Trustees were an Easter egg hunt, table top sale, a fashion show and a barn dance with "Fen Blow". Events so far in this calendar year include a very successful 'gig' by "The Lonely" rock band. The hall has maintained its position as the venue for Parish Council meetings and the internationally known "Ely Guild of Wood Turners" as well as for various other local organisations both from within and outside the village, including "Women's Institute", ladies fitness classes, children's dance classes, "Campaign Amateur Theatre" rehearsals, "Playright Children's Theatre" performances and since March weekly term time Mums & Toddlers sessions run by "Little Thetford Acorns". Witchford Amateur Dramatic Society and "Dog Sense" (a dog sensory training organisation) are amongst other groups using the hall on an *ad hoc* basis and as it has for many years the hall continues to sponsor the weekly Post Office. An indication of the appreciation of the hall by the community is, I believe, the increase in hirings for children's birthday parties and hardly a week goes by without one such event or similar.

As already noted, John House resigned as both Treasurer and Trustee earlier this year and Peter Frew came onto the Board and a new Parish Councillor, Trevor Dickenson, joined the Board as a Parish Council nominee following the May elections.

Hot air hand driers have been purchased (although not yet installed) for the kitchen and disabled toilet and to

improve the provision in the ladies. Trustees have discussed informally the possibility of implementing a different system for hot water supply to all toilets which would be more economical in the long term and it is hoped that definite plans for that and other improvement projects will be forthcoming within this calendar year as finances may permit. Trustees have continued to seek economies in maintenance and running costs without reducing services or standards or having to raise fees, although some slight adjustments have been made recently and the scale of fees charged to users will continue to be kept under review. A cleaner is employed for three hours a week but all other caretaking and maintenance tasks not requiring professional expertise are undertaken on a voluntary basis by Trustees who also make regular donations of their own equipment, abilities & finances. A water leak, which before it was discovered in April, resulted in a considerable charge by Anglia Water for 'lost' water although a rebate for most of the cost has been received; the leak was finally repaired through the good offices of a Trustee at a fraction of the cost that might otherwise have occurred.

Together with the Parish Council, the Sports & Social Club and Little Thetford Acorns, the Village Hall remains a stakeholder in the Parish recreational facilities situated on "Oakfield".

A number of Trustees have indicated their wish to stand down from the Board over the next year or so, and in particular your Chairman who has been stating this for several years and I now give notice that, if elected from this meeting, it will be the last year that I shall serve. This is

no longer a threat but a definite statement of intent; this Trustee will not serve, in any capacity, after the AGM next year. Over the preceding years appeals have been repeatedly made at the Annual Parish Meeting, through the pages of the village newsletter as well as in informal conversations for other Parishioners to become executive Trustees. The necessity for such in the next twelve months is now a reality.

Parish Council

PEASE Taxi Service, Ely. 07802 507862 Airports – Seaports All Long Distance Work At its meeting on 13 July, Alison Kilby, having offered her services and declared she was eligible, was co-opted to the Council as the seventh Councillor; the Council now has its full complement of Councillors. Parishioners are reminded that Parish Council meetings, usually held on the second Monday of each month in the Village Hall are open meetings at which the public may attend the whole meeting and speak on matters on the agenda. The agenda and other details are posted on the village noticeboard. The condition of the cycle path into Ely is still causing concern and the Council

is doing its best to work with other agencies to have it improved although little progress is being made at this time despite constant urging by Councillors.

The "Keep Britain Tidy – '*We're watching you'* campaign" against dog fouling had been investigated by a Councillor who reported that involvement in the scheme is costly and Council decided the Parish does not have the finances to enter the scheme unilaterally. Dog fouling in the village remains a problem and residents are again urged to please clear up after their dogs and not to leave the bags lying around but to put them in the dog bins provided around the village. A replacement bin for the one destroyed by vandalism in Cowslip Drive is still awaited from ECDC.

Councillors had no objections to a planning application for a wooden structure to form a short-term 'granny' annex convertible long-term to a garage to the rear of "The Acacias" on Ely Road.

Approval was given for a new memorial for an ashes burial plot in the cemetery. Concern was expressed at the manner in which graves are currently being prepared and the Cemetery working group will meet to review the cemetery regulations.

As a trial the safety and condition of the play area and equipment has been monitored for the last three months by qualified inspectors from ECDC who are reporting monthly to the PC. Councillors were satisfied that the system is working well and a contract to continue will be entered into with ECDC and the Clerk will investigate having the District Council's approved contractor carry out minor repairs as highlighted by the inspections. Unfortunately a discarded flick-knife had been found and removed by the ECDC inspector at his last visit; MJS Gardening Services.
