Parish Council.

The Parish Council was represented at the Remembrance Sunday Service in St. Georges Church on November 9th and was one of the organisations to lay a wreath at the War Memorial in the cemetery after the service.

At the October meeting a quote for work on the cherry trees and other trees in the area behind the Village Notice Boards was accepted following the receipt of permission for work on the Cherry Trees from East Cambs. District Council (E.C.D.C.). The ash tree in The Wyches near the entrance to the car park which had

raised concern has been inspected by County Council Highways who do not believe it to be a risk – no further action will be taken by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council received 2 applications for the vacancy of a Trustee to the John Townsend Charity – Mrs Christine Howard was appointed.

A new Internal Auditor has been appointed for the year and the External Auditors Report has been received for last year and its content noted.

Planning – The application to build a detached dwelling on land adjacent to 4 Holt Fen has been refused by E.C.D.C. as has an application to build a detached dwelling at 3 Holt Fen. Approval has been granted for the construction of a detached dwelling and extensions and modifications to the existing dwelling at 19 Main Street. Councillors raised no objections to an application to build a new garage, an external store and studio at 31a The Wyches.

The investigation into providing sand bags in the village in case of future flooding has, so far, not proved to be financially viable for the Parish Council. E.C.D.C. recommend householders make their own arrangements. However a Councillor has agreed to make further enquiries to see if a viable compromise can be reached.

A new Cemetery Caretaker has been appointed. Mr John Skipper took on the role from the beginning of November. The water tap in the cemetery has been repaired and lagged and thanks are due Mr K Wright for dealing with this in a timely manner.

Cllr Bill Hunt attended the November meeting and spoke as a County Councillor of his support for the Southern Bypass, his hopes for retaining the waste re-cycling centre at Witchford with a possible reduction in hours, the possible earlier switch off for some street lights, both for reasons of economy, County Council archives are going to be relocated to Ely and new cash ticket machines are being installed at Park and Ride sites.

His enthusiasm for the new Zipper Bus for the 'Grunty Fen Villages' was evident. At District Level again for economy reasons E.C.D.C. is to be reduced to 27 Councillors. County Council archives are going to be relocated to Ely.

Timetables for the Zipper bus service have been delivered to all the houses in the village Cllr Staines has some spare copies if anyone has mislaid their copy. A contribution towards publicity for this new service was agreed.

A further reminder that next May an election for a new Parish Council will be held. Anyone interested in becoming a Parish Councillor will be required to nominate themselves for election (it is not a matter of invitation!). Publicity is given to this process in good time so watch for the announcements to be made. Our request to reduce the Council to 7 members has been approved and we are asking parishioners to seriously consider standing as Parish Councillors at the elections next year. In a small Parish a local council is vitally important, only local people can give genuine and fair consideration to local matters. If you would like to know more about the role of a Parish Councillor please speak to one of our present Councillors or come along to a Parish Council Meeting held on the 2nd Monday of the month – next one December 8th at 7:30pm in the Village Hall.

Village Hall.

The Village Hall urgently needs YOUR help.

By its constitution the Village Hall is administered by its Trustees under the rules of the Charity Commission. No maximum number is stipulated but every organisation or institution within the village may nominate up to two people to serve on the board as a trustee. Currently only the Parish Council has representatives on the Village Hall's board of trustees. No other is currently represented by even one nominee although some Trustees do wear 'two hats' as members of more than one organisation without being formally its representative. Trustee numbers are made up of 'independent' members who whilst not representing any particular organisation are concerned for the continuation of village amenities. The shortage of trustees is putting a huge burden on those currently in post. Due to the recent resignation of the treasurer to the Trustees we **urgently** need new Trustee to take on the role of **treasurer**. This need not be a particularly demanding task – the pay role for our one employee is managed by Cambs.ACRE for example. Obviously a knowledge of bookkeeping and some experience of financial management of small organisations would be an advantage. Please do give this matter your thought and should you feel that it is a role within our Village community that you are able to take on, I will be delighted to hear from you. (tel 649268 or email robert.bullen1@tesco.net) The outgoing treasurer is happy to give any new incumbent every assistance in taking over. The present Trustees are very aware that several of their number have indicated that they will be unable to serve for much longer – the current chair in particular will not serve after the 2016 AGM (if he lasts that long!) and consequently unless the board of Trustees is strengthened now the future of the Village Hall is in jeopardy and that will have a disastrous knock-on effect on living in Little Thetford as we know it.
