Cream Teas at St. Georges. The first event will be Cream Teas in the Churchyard on Saturday 17th. May 2.00 p.m. until 5.00 p.m. Come along and have a chat and watch the world go by in a stress free zone! St. Georges Flower Festival. We are holding our Flower Festival over the weekend of 20th. 21st. September. The theme will be "Lest We Forget" a commemoration of the First World War. As well as the displays, Mike Petty has again agreed to come and give one of his wonderful talks - this time on the effects of the conflict on communities such as ours. More details nearer the date. On the Sunday evening we will have a service of evensong at 6.00 p.m. The Rev. John Sansom has kindly agreed to take this for us. Commemorative plaque. In the Church, near the organ, is a plaque commemorating the sacrifice that young men from this village made during the first world war. There are the names of ten who lost their lives, but we believe that two more should also be there. The plaque is 90 years old and needs renovation and we believe that this year is the time to do it and at the same time add the two missing names. We hope that the Flower Festival will raise money towards the cost of this work, but it is unlikely to be sufficient to cover all the costs. We intend to ask for support from other organisations in the village, and indeed, anyone who, like us, feels that this is a worthwhile cause. Please contact Tony Shaw, if you would like to help. If all goes according to plan, we intend to have the Rev. John Sansom rededicate the plaque at the evensong service on 21st. September.

The Spring term in school is now drawing to a close and it has been another busy and lively term. The children have all been working hard on a range of different topics. Years 5 and 6 have been investigating plant life and the environment culminating in a trip to the Botanical Gardens. This is a wonderful natural outdoor classroom which helped bring their learning to life and develop their observational skills, as well as supporting their science work.

Years 3 and 4 have been contrasting our island with the beautiful Caribbean island of St Lucia. Parish Council

From the February meeting Councillors agreed to send a letter of support to Ely & Soham Dial a Ride regarding the proposed cut in funding from the County Council.

Planning permission has been granted retrospectively by East Cambs. District Council for the change of use for a parcel of land in Ely Road. Permission for a wood burning stove and installation of a flue at 7c Main Street was sought and a proposal for the removal of a hedgerow on a public footpath near Braham Farm had been submitted for comment. The PC supported both applications.

The grass cutting contract for 2014 was awarded to MJS Gardening Services.

A donation was made to the Magpas Helimedix funds.

At their March meeting Councillors were pleased to hear that the bid submitted for the Local Highways Improvement Initiative had been successful and thanks were given to the clerk for her written submission. This bid was to move back the kerb just past the bus stop so that when there is a queue of cars at the A10 junction those wishing to turn towards Stretham can get through to the slip road so lessening the queue. The Parish Council will be asked to pay a small percentage of the cost.

The litter pick at the beginning of March was successful in that the volunteers rounded up approximately 12 bags of rubbish and other assorted articles which were later cleared by Veolia. A sincere thank you to all who turned up to help with this annual event.

Many of you will have noticed that the benches around the Parish have been treated and some repairs made – we are most grateful to Mr Dewey for giving his time to do this.

An opportunity had arisen for the Parish Council to comment on the Draft Ely Gateway Supplementary Planning Document the response was to ensure there was great improvement to parking at the station and to consider including a safer cycleway from our area to the station.

The damage to Holt Fen caused by contractors using heavy vehicles on the wet ground has been reported to Network Rail and a response awaited regarding the making good of the damage.

Commemoration of the outbreak of World War 1 was considered and Councillors were pleased to hear that St Georges Church and The Brigade will be marking this occasion (see St Georges Church entry). It was decided to organise a short event at the War Memorial early in August – further details nearer the time. It is also hoped to plant poppies in the conservation area.

Cllr. Bullen, as the designated local footpath person, had consulted with the Rights of Way Officer at the County Council and agreed to speak again with the resident who had brought a concern to the Parish

Council about Holt Fen Drove. A letter from a resident about the signage for Watsons Lane has been passed to East Cambs. Council who are responsible body for road signage.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday April 14th in the Village Hall.

The Annual Parish Meeting.

Will be held on Wednesday April 30^{th} at 7:30pm in the Village Hall. This is the meeting where all local organisations are invited to report on their activities, it is hoped that County and District Councillors will be present and all who live in the Parish are invited to attend.

Moving forward with Youth Work in Lt. Thetford....... you will have read in the last Newsletter that the Parish Council had been in contact with the Connexions 'Bus Project about some Youth Work in the village. Sadly their Projects Manager is still unwell and cannot commit to being present at a meeting. However the Parish Council is keen to further this project and has arranged a public meeting to meet with parents, members of the community and of course some of the young people to see if, with the support of the community, a Youth Club can be formed.

The date of the meeting is **Thursday April 24th at 7:30pm in The Village Hall.** It is important that parents are involved with this project from the start because without adult input this will not happen. So please come along have a cup of coffee and talk to us about how you think this can be developed as a community project. There will be an agenda but there will be ample time for input from all present. If you have a young person in your family between the age of 11 – 16 then do please come along.
