Village Hall

Fifty or so people attended the "last chance to save the village hall" crisis meeting on April 25th., some representing organisations within the village and other users of the hall, others on behalf of themselves and their families and everybody concerned about the future of the hall. A number of other parishioners indicated their interest and sent apologies for not being able to be there. The result of the meeting was that more than a dozen people indicated their willingness to become Trustees of the hall and thereby help to ensure the hall's survival for the foreseeable future. Included in their number are several current Trustees who have agreed to continue to serve for at least a further year to help with continuity. The next step will be for those who have indicated their willingness to become or continue to be Trustees to fully commit at the AGM and be elected to the Board. It will be up to the new Board to decide on future operation – things will not have to be done in the same ways as hitherto – but for the time being I feel confident to continue to take bookings for the rest of this year and indeed for next year, which are already starting to come in.

The AGM, which of course is open to EVERYBODY, not just the committed few, will be on

Robert Bullen (retiring chair of Trustees: Little Thetford Village Hall)

PARISH COUNCIL

At its meeting on 9 May the Council elected Robert Bullen to be chair for the next year. The election of a vice chair is to be held over until the June Council. Cllrs. Stubbs and Bullen were nominated as village hall representatives; Cllrs. Ballantyne, Bullen and Stoeber to the Planning working group and Cllrs. Stubbs, Kilby and Dickenson to the Cemetery working group. The required annual reviews were conducted. 'Standing Orders and Financial Regulations' and the 'Complaints Procedure' were re-adopted without alteration. The 'Asset Register' was adjusted and amended as necessary. Insurance is satisfactory although the Clerk will investigate an alternative insurer to secure a price reduction if possible. "Council and Employees Memberships of Other Bodies" was further endorsed with the exception that the Council decided to cease its membership to the C.P.R.E. as it was felt that little or no benefit to the parish is derived from the continued contributions and a small saving on expense could be made. The Accounts to year ended 31 March 2016 were approved. Council learned that applications for planning consent had been approved by

ECDC for land/dwellings at 11, 13 and 15 Main Street and at 19 Main Street, as was, in principle, the application for land opposite 12 Holt Fen. Cllrs. found no objections to applications for rear extensions at 2 Chapel Close or 12 Palisade Court. Some reservations were considered regarding permission for an extension at 38 New Close Road but decided to recommend approval to ECDC. Councillors gave serious consideration to an amended application for land south of "Two Acres caravan park" to increase the proposed development from 8 to 10 dwellings but were adamant that their considerable objections expressed with regard to the original application remained and these were to be strongly re-emphasised to the Planning Authority. The Highway Authority is again to be urged, as a matter of safety, to expedite the improvement of white-lining at the A.10 junction. Mrs. Christine Howard has been appointed to fill one PC vacancy to the "John Townsend Charity". A Parishioner has, with the approval of the Highways Authority, kindly cut back the overgrown hedge along the link path from The Wyches to New Close Road. However, your Council wishes to remind residents that a gardening contractor is employed to carry out environmental maintenance to the cemetery and parish land and in the interests of the safety of all Parishioners no grass cutting or hedge or ditch maintenance (with the exception of highway grass verges in front of individual properties) should be carried out without the approval of the land owner(s) (usually the Parish Council or Highways Authority.)

Cambridgeshire Handyperson Service

Age UK Cambridgeshire are delighted to offer a new Handyperson service covering the whole of Cambridgeshire. The service is aimed at people aged 65 and over or those with a disability. The new service is now up and running.

An Age UK Trusted Assessor will visit you in your own home to complete a Wellbeing and Home Check assessment. Grab rails can be provided and installed free of charge and any handyperson works will incur a charge of £25 per hour plus the cost of the materials used. We are also able to offer Keysafe installations which will be charged at £45 including supply of the item. All works will be carried out by approved Age UK contractors.

Examples of the types of handyperson works we can offer are:

- Fixing dripping taps
- Making telephone cables and extensions safe
- Changing light bulbs (unless these can be fitted during the Home Assessment)
- Replacing a fuse
- Small carpentry work
- Changing curtains
- Hanging pictures
- Putting up shelves

The above list is by no means exhaustive, and if there are any other small jobs you feel we can help you with please get in touch with us and ask.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Neighbourhood Watch in East Cambs. is growing in numbers, but unfortunately not in Little Thetford. You might wonder whether this is important to which the answer must be YES. We are in a period of cuts which is resulting in a reduction of staff within the police and local authority support services. It may not be admitted by the authorities but reduced staff numbers invariable result in a reduced service. Neighbourhood Watch is in some way filling the gap.

Neighbourhood Watch was established to work with the local police force to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and also the fear of crime and anti-social behaviour. This support to the police force is as important now as it ever was. But it is also there to encourage neighbourliness and to tackle problems other than serious crime, e.g. graffiti, fly tipping, dog fouling, abandoned cars, noisy dogs or noisy neighbours and

numerous more. Many residents, particularly the elderly fight shy of contacting faceless officials on such matters, but a neighbourhood watch coordinator would be there to fight your corner.

You might ask who this coordinator might be; it is the person designated to oversee a neighbourhood watch scheme usually of about 20 to 50 houses. Might you be such a person?
