#### PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council has website. now its own littlethetfordparishcouncil.btck.co.uk. It is still in its infancy and will be added to as time goes on. Much more information regarding the Parish Council, its personnel, meetings and decisions will be included as well as links to other authorities, organisations and the Clerk. However, the Council recognises that not every parishioner uses the internet and for the time being at least information will still be published in the newsletter and on the noticeboard.

Repairs to the carousel and 'Burma bridge' in the playground have been authorised and these should be taking place shortly as will the replacement of the gate. As with all things of this nature we are in the hands of the contractors and, of course, the weather. On the subject of gates, Council is aware of the difficulties being experienced with the cemetery gate and is trying to find a suitable contractor to repair it whilst retaining its historic and aesthetic appearance. Council has also been pleased to approve the erection of memorial stones for two recent graves. Trees on the green in The Wyches that overhang the noticeboards are to be inspected by the ECDC trees officer for advice on their safety and maintenance.

Council continues to press the highways authority regarding the white lining at the A10 corner as previous promises of action have still to materialise.

On planning matters, Council understands that the Authority (ECDC) has refused an application for an extension and alterations to 38 New Close Road, whereas approval has been given for a single storey front and side extension at 7 New Close Road and the revised plans for land south of the caravan site. Council has no objection to the small amendment to previously approved plans for 3 Holt Fen and after very careful consideration and a site visit has recommended acceptance of plans for a detached bungalow to the rear of 12 The Wyches.

Following a presentation from the district co-ordinator for "Speed watch" and representations from residents of Red Fen Road, Council is supportive of the setting up of a Speed Watch team for the village. The scheme, which is approved and supported by the police, requires several volunteers who have no powers other than to operate the monitoring equipment and to report incidents of speeding to the police who may then issue cautions. Interested residents should contact the co-ordinator for the initiative, Charlotte Mitchell 07968 970491 A suggestion for a speed restriction and traffic calming measures in Red Fen Road is to be put to the highways authority for consideration under the 'local highways minor improvement scheme'.

Council has been informed of concerns felt by several residents of suspected illegal and antisocial activities becoming increasingly prevalent in several areas of the village. The Clerk will pass this information to the police but residents are advised to report to police, by calling 101 or 999 if they consider it urgent, at the time they witness such activity and give as much information as they can; callers may request that police do not visit them or divulge their identity.

For residents annoyed, distressed or inconvenienced by the interruptions in power supply regularly experienced in the village there is now a 'help line' set up to report failures and obtain more information. Access by calling 105.

Parish Council meetings normally take place on the second Monday of each month at 7.30pm in the village hall and are open to all. The agenda for each meeting is posted on the noticeboard 5 clear days beforehand or check the website.

Lisa paid tribute to the outgoing Chairperson, Robert, for his steady leadership and inexhaustible dedication.

The new board will now develop a Village Hall website and the Chairperson has appointed working parties amongst the Trustees to focus on fund raising and marketing. The board of Trustees welcome new ideas from the community on events and other uses for the Village Hall.

The Village Hall is a valuable community asset providing an affordable venue for community groups and private functions. The board believe it is important to reach out to the local community and promote the Village Hall as the first choice venue for local people. Were you aware of the Post Office service available Monday mornings at the Village Hall, Acorns Mums and Toddlers sessions Tuesday morning or fitness classes on Tuesday evenings? However, the Hall remains underused and the board want to change this to the benefit of local people.

Little Thetford Village Hall is a registered charity and a non-profit organisation with any revenue reinvested in the hall for maintenance, improvements, and repairs.
