#### **PARISH COUNCIL**

The transfer of the play area (for which the Parish pays a rent to ECDC) from District to Parish is in hand. The renewal of the play area fencing has now been completed.

<u>Planning:</u> Approval has been given by the Authority (ECDC) for remedial tree works at 31a The Wyches and 6 Orchid Close. The Authority has approved the plan for a 4 bedroom, 2 storey house opposite *Berrycroft* in Red Fen Road. The Parish Council has made comments to the Authority on applications for developments between the cemetery and the playing fields and for 3 houses on land east of 1-4 Holt Fen, citing increased traffic congestion, lack of infrastructure, poor access and visibility, over-development and possible surface flooding as appropriate as concerns. Taking into use the cemetery extension which is soon

to become necessary does not require any further planning permission from the Authority but does require a statutory geographic and hydrographic assessment for approval by the Environment Agency. Professional consultants have been appointed by the Council to commission the necessary reports, submit them to the EA and advise the Parish on the outcome. It is not anticipated that there will be any complications.

Council has approved memorials to be erected in the cemetery on graves for the Young, Dickenson and Hazell families.

As part of the proposed traffic calming measures to be adopted in Red Fen Road a plan for a 40mph speed limit has been circulated by the highways authority to the statutory consultees for comment. So far no objections have been made and further plans are awaited from CCC. Sec.137 donations of £150 each have been made by Council to MAGPAS Air Ambulance, Little Thetford Village Hall to assist in asbestos removal from the boiler cupboard, and Little Thetford Feast.

The Parish is to take over from CCC the maintenance of the footpath between The Wyches and New Close Road which although of cost to the Parish will, it is anticipated, improve the overall upkeep of the footpath.

The Conservation Area is in very good condition and is developing into a beautiful area for walking, picnicing (but PLEASE take your rubbish away with you) relaxing and enjoying natural surroundings with many species of butterflies, dragonflies, birds and wild plants colonising it.

Mrs. Brenda Dickenson is to be the Parish Council appointee to fill a vacancy on the board of John Townsend Charity.

# Neighbourhood Watch

A clean village is a safe village. Keeping Little Thetford bright and tidy is fundamental to maintaining a pleasant and peaceful environment for all who live here. However, we cannot rely on council refuse collectors and street sweeper vehicles alone, as residents we have

our part to play too. Little Thetford Neighbourhood watch has encountered incidents of fly tipping in the village, which is a blight on our village and an invitation to unscrupulous individuals to dump their rubbish on our communal areas.

If you see an incident of fly-tipping be discrete, but try to note the following details:

The date, time and the place where the tipping is taking place, what the waste is and how much there is of it, and a description of any vehicles involved and the registration numbers.

Do not try to approach any one you see dumping rubbish but contact the Council with the information you have. Fly tipping can be reported to the council through their customer services team on 01353 665555.

No-one needs to resort to dumping items in our communal areas, or private land. If you have additional household items you want to get rid of, then contact the Council on 01353 665555. The charge for this service is £22 for up to 3 items or £22 each for a fridge/freezer.

We are all affected by fly tipping if you see it happening report it. Fly tipping is anti – social behaviour which as a community we must have zero tolerance for.
