PARISH COUNCIL

Council has recommended to the Planning Authority (ECDC) that two additional sites put forward to the Authority for inclusion in the District Plan (land east of the caravan park and land off the A10 partly in Stretham) should not be included in the plan on sustainability, infrastructure, traffic and countryside development grounds.

A local contractor has been asked to estimate for additional grass cutting within the village (excluding the A10 corner) to enable Councillors to assess the viability of accepting Cambridgeshire CC offer of funding to the Parish to take on the service.

Discussions continue with ECDC on the possibility/viability of the Parish obtaining ownership of the playpark area and green space in New Close Road.

Councillors are very aware of residents' concerns regarding perceived antisocial parking and other activities in New Close Road in particular and continue to attempt dialogue with *Sanctuary Housing*, so far without success.

The upgrade to the fencing and gate to the play area should be commencing very shortly as soon as the material is supplied by the manufacturer.

At the May Council Meeting Robert Bullen was re-elected chair, and Trevor Dickenson vice chair of the Parish Council for the year. Charlotte Mitchell was co-opted as a Councillor to fill the vacancy.

Councillors have met with the Highways dept. project manager to attempt to achieve a plan for Red Fen Road traffic calming measures as a result of the recent success in obtaining a grant for such under the Local Highways Improvement

scheme. Various suggestions put to CCC are under consideration and a definitive plan, that has to come in under £4,000, is awaited. Although it seems a fairly large sum of money Councillors understand that given current costs, County Council policies, policing considerations and the topography of the location, not a great deal can actually be achieved although Cllrs. will continue to press for as good a deal as possible. 'Highways' have made it quite clear that the provision of official



passing places on Red Fen Road is financially impossible at this time and even the making good of road side and verge pot holes will not be undertaken by the Authority.

All Parish Council meetings are open to the public, the next being scheduled for 12 June and 10 July.

Little Thetford Neighbourhood Watch

Many of you may have heard about Little Thetford Neighbourhood Watch and seen the signs on the lamp posts, and are wondering what is it all about?

The objective of Little Thetford Neighbourhood Watch is:

- to bring neighbours together to create a strong, friendly, active community where crime and anti-social behaviour are less likely to happen.
- The aim of our scheme is **focused on trust and respect in which people are safe from crime and enjoy a good quality of life.**
- Neighbourhood Watch is about *making sure that fewer people feel afraid, vulnerable or isolated in the place where they live.*

Neighbourhood Watch is supported through volunteers who act as coordinators of the scheme for the street in which they live. We have managed to cover most of Little Thetford, but need coordinators for New Close Road, parts of Cowslip Drive, Ely Road, and Orchid Close.

The job of a coordinator is:

- To communicate helpful crime prevention advice and tips to the neighbours in their street.
- Coordinators also provide a helpful link between the Police and the local community ensuring news and advice is passed on as well as letting Police know about local concerns.
- To enroll you to the "ecops" scheme, an email alert system advising subscribers about incidents of crime occurring in their local area,
- Advise on how Residents can report suspicious activity, and how to look out for your neighbour.

Neighbourhood Watch is well-known to help reduce burglary, anti-social behaviour, doorstep crime and environmental problems. How is Neighbourhood Watch so effective? By being a trusted source of information and support for people within their communities and keeping their eyes open for those who might be vulnerable.

Criminals rely on the deterioration of neighbourly concern where people mind their own business and do not report suspicious behaviour. This is a fate we do not wish for Little Thetford and all we need to do is be neighbourly.

There are no gimmicks, no intrusion, no hassle. All we need is for people to look out for one another, take notice of the elderly and vulnerable people in our village and give each other the feeling of safety through being neighbourly.

The erosion of a community is a slow process when gradually people only care about themselves, this opens the door to anti-social behaviour and crime. Being neighbourly is the best way to counter the breakdown of a community and repel the rot that comes with it. All you need to do is look out for one another. If you want to know:

- who your coordinator is
- how you can receive information on crime prevention
- sign up to "ecops" the email alert system
- live on New Close Road, Cowslip Drive, Ely Road or Orchid Close and want to become a coordinator
